#### **Comments received**

### Matter: Woodside's projects on the Burrup

### Claims:

- The Burrup Hub project poses a direct threat to coral ecosystems and endangered turtle populations.
- 54 threatened animal species have been identified as at direct risk of being impacted.
- Woodside has a track record of poor maintenance, operational failure and damaging decommissioning that presents an unacceptable risk to the marine environment in the event of a hydrocarbon spill.
- Fossil fuel projects are not the future

### Titleholder Response

Woodside clarifies that the Julimar Appraisal Drilling and Surveys Petroleum Activities Program (hereafter, the Petroleum Activities Program) is not part of Woodside's projects on the Burrup Peninsula and that the Environment that May be Affected (EMBA) by the Petroleum Activities Program does not extend to the Dampier Archipelago. This comment does not relate to the Petroleum Activities Program or the associated Environment Plan (EP).

Woodside implements a robust environmental impact and risk assessment process for each project, which is detailed within the associated EP. Sections 2.6 and 2.7 of the EP for the Petroleum Activities Program details this process. These sections outline how the performance, or 'track record', of Woodside and the broader industry is factored into the assessment process. Subsequent evaluation of potential environmental impact and risk, including consideration of identified threatened species or habitats, and demonstration of acceptability to as low as reasonably practicable (ALARP) is provided in Section 6 of the EP.

No updates have been made to the EP.

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
